



## The 48 Hour Film Project

### CALLING ALL FILMMAKERS!

The 48 Hour Film Project is coming to Boston! In a wild, sleepless weekend, you and a team will make a movie--write, shoot, edit and score it. From scratch. In 48 hours. On Friday, April 8th, you'll get a character, a prop, a line of dialogue and a genre, all to include in your movie. By Sunday, April 10th, the movie must be complete. It will show in the Brattle Theatre either Tuesday or Wednesday that week.

#### **There are three ways to be involved:**

1. FORM A TEAM. If you can rustle up enough folks to make a movie, great! The project is open to pros and amateurs alike. Just line your team up, download the application from our webpage (<http://www.48hourfilm.com>), fill it in, pay the fee, and then meet us on Friday, April 8th, ready to go. There are only a limited number of slots, so make sure you get your application in early.

2. JOIN A TEAM. If you're interested in participating, but can't form a team, you can still definitely be involved! There will be at least one meet'n'greet where folks can meet team leaders and join their teams.
